

WHAT IS SNAP?

AAR's Spay and Neuter Assistance Program (SNAP) is designed to reduce the ever-growing population of unwanted and unloved pets in Walton County. To encourage pet owners to have their pets (cats and dogs) spayed or neutered, AAR will pay a fixed amount toward the cost of the procedure if pre-approved by AAR.

ELIGIBILITY

The pet owner must

Be a resident of Walton County.

If the pet is not vaccinated against rabies, agree to have the animal vaccinated at their expense at or prior to the surgical procedure.

Other humane groups, animals adopted from other humane groups, or individuals in the business of breeding or selling animals are not eligible.

PET OWNER RESPONSIBILITIES

Complete the SNAP application. We recommend you make contact at this time with the participating veterinarian of your choice. Confirm if any additional procedures are required. Prices and additional procedures may vary.

Have proof of a current rabies vaccination or have the animal vaccinated at your expense.

After being approved by AAR, make an appointment with your participating veterinarian.

Pay all charges above the subsidized amount directly to the veterinarian. AAR will only pay the pre-approved amount.

VETERINARIAN RESPONSIBILITIES

Schedule and perform the surgical procedure.

Bill the pet owner for any charges above the pre-approved amount.

Return the completed certificate to AAR to receive payment of the subsidized amount.

AAR RESPONSIBILITIES

Approve or disapprove SNAP applications. AAR reserves the right to deny assistance to any applicant.

Ensure sufficient funds are available to cover all approved subsidies.

Promptly pay the veterinarian after the procedure is completed and the SNAP certificate is returned to AAR by the attending veterinarian.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

AAR will be responsible for the following amounts when a pre-approved procedure is performed by a participating veterinarian under the SNAP program. Any additional charges, including the cost of a rabies vaccination if the animal has not already been inoculated, will be the responsibility of the pet owner. When the procedure being performed is the spaying of a dog, the size of the dog will be determined by the veterinarian performing the procedure using his/her standard office policy.
